WEEE Compliance and Take-Back Program



Time Domain is committed to meeting the requirements of the European Union (EU) Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) Directive, which went into effect August 13, 2005. The WEEE Directive requires producers of Electrical and Electronic Equipment (EEE) to address the waste stream of EEE and imparts recycling responsibilities and related costs to the producer.

Time Domain products affected by the WEEE Directive are labeled with a crossed-out "wheeie-bin" symbol (see above) which indicates that the product was placed on the market after August 13, 2005 and that these products should be separated from other product waste at end-of- life.

WEEE compliance will be achieved by the Time Domain "Take-Back and Recycle" program that will properly dispose of WEEE products that have reached their end of useful life and Time Domain has partnered with Sims Recycling Solutions to recycle surplus electronic equipment at many locations within the European Union.
